About us

The Barna Way is an organic social farm, creative hub and native woodland on the Wild Atlantic Way, one mile from the famous Ballybunion surf beach in County Kerry, Ireland. The house and lands are steeped in history, song and tradition.

The Barna Way is about a holistic way of being and we try to be as self sufficient as possible. It is about creating an inclusive and welcoming space for all. We are host farmers with the Kerry Social Farming project. The North Kerry GIY (Grow It Yourself) Group is based in Barna and has over 20 active members who visit each other's farms/gardens monthly during the growing season.

We collaborate with Leagh Farm to host the very successful 'Ballybunion Community Market' every Saturday morning over the summer season. This is a great opportunity for the local community and visitors to support local food and craft producers. Our vegetables are certified with the Irish Organic Association.

We host a number of creative experiences and workshops throughout the year and particularly in conjunction with the local MOYA festival including 'Art in Nature' 'Songs for the Spirit' and 'Living Lens'.

We facilitate projects relating to food, biodiversity and climate action such as the '30 Day Local Food Challenge' and 'The Local Food Project'. This is book about the power of eating local food to increase health and well being, reduce plastic and carbon and support local food producers.
